In exercise of the powers conferred by clauses (b) and (C) of Section 7 of the Customs Act, 1962, the Central Government recognised a Land Customs

Station at Jaigaon.

The Royal Government of Bhutan and Government of India sign an Agreement on Trade, Commerce and Transit. The Protocol to the Agreement recognises

Jaigaon and twenty other routes as points of entry

and exit between the two countries.

2021, September

Land Port Authorities of India <u>prepared</u> the Detailed Project Report which identified 122 acres of land for development of a Land Port at Jaigaon. The State Government of West Bengal was requested to initiate

the process of Land Acquisition.

2023, April

During Bhutanese King Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuk's visit to New Delhi, India, and Bhutan agreed to expedite the process of setting up the first Integrated Check Post along the borders of Jaigaon and Phuentsholing, the busiest trading points

between the two countries.
